**C& J Report – Spring HOD 2026**

Although it is uncommon for a sitting President to also serve as the Contest & Judging Vice President, I am confident that my recent involvement in Society initiatives, district operations, and the judging system equips me to successfully fulfill both roles for the remainder of the term.

Our current single-convention format combines the District Quartet Championship and International Qualification into one contest session. Under this structure, the Bagley Rule—originally intended for a two-convention system—no longer functions effectively.

Last year, the rule required all 13 district quartets to advance to the finals, resulting in **16 total finalists**. This created an overly long finals session and delayed judges' evaluations late into the evening.

To prevent similar issues, the board proposes **removing the Bagley Rule**.

Under the updated system:

Top 10 quartets advance to the finals

11th-place quartet serves as mic tester

The Fund grew by \$24,036 in 2025. The Fund's market performance, not including cash in bank, was up 15%. The S&P 500, including reinvested dividends, was up 18%.

Am Century returned 12% (average annual return since inception in 2002 was 8%). Janus Forty returned 18% (avg. annual return since inception in 1992 was 15%). Janus bond fund returned 8% (avg annual return since inception 2009 was 3%). \$5000 was sold from Janus Forty for cash.

At 12/31/25 the equity ratio was 86%. Guideline is 40 to 80% equity.

During 2025, contributions received totaled \$3029 including \$940 from IDEA Direct. Disbursements totaled \$7882.11 - YIH \$6000, 2026 HCMW scholarships \$850 (2025 HCMW refunded \$595), Chicago Metro contest \$500, Lake County show fundraiser \$500, & bank fees \$32.11.

Since inception in 1990, contributions to Fund have totaled \$59,332. Disbursements since inception have totaled \$53,816.54 - \$19,636 for IDAH, Jamboree, HCMW, Top Gun & quartets, \$21,146 for YIH, \$2643 for COTS, \$2500 for district website, \$4250 for chapters, and \$3656 for IDEA printing, bank fees & other admin. costs.

Receipts less disbursements over the 34 years have netted \$5,515 that has grown through investments to \$221,154.69.

Proposal to Remove the Bagley Rule for Quartet Finals Qualification

In previous years, our district held two separate conventions: one for the District Quartet Championship and one for International Quartet Qualification. Under that structure, the Bagley Rule—which allowed all district quartets to advance to the finals if 13 or fewer were registered—functioned as intended.

However, we now operate with a *single* convention where both contests take place in the same session. This change creates complications the original rule never accounted for.

Last year, we had:

- 13 non-champion quartets (District Championship)
- 2 past champion quartets (International Qualifier)
- 1 out-of-district quartet (International Qualifier)

Although the combined field totaled 16, the Bagley Rule required all 13 district quartets to advance, resulting in **16 finalists**. This significantly extended the Saturday finals and delayed the judges' evaluation sessions well into the evening.

To prevent repeat situations and ensure a fair, efficient, and manageable contest, the board is proposing to remove the Bagley Rule. Under the proposed system, **the top 10 non-champion quartets** will advance to the finals, with the **11th-place quartet serving as the mic testers**.

The only exception: If any past champion and/or out-of-district quartets score within three points of the society's target score in the semi-finals they must be included in the finals, even if this creates more than 10 finalists. (In 2026 the target score for quartets is 81, so any quartet scoring 78 or above in the semi-finals would be in the finals).

This change aligns our process with the modern contest structure and provides a smoother, more predictable experience for competitors, judges, and attendees.
