Membership Report for the Illinois District

September 4, 2026

The current membership of the Illinois District is 494, which reflects a decline of seven members since January of this year. There are currently 25 chapters listed as active by the BHS, two of which have only one member and are not currently meeting.

Three chapters have fewer than 10 members. They are Macomb, Bureau County, and Peoria. Long time Macomb member and current President Craig Rigg reports the chapter remains active despite low turnout. They usually sing with around 10 members. Despite losing a co-director, the Prairieland Chorus has sung as guests with the local choral society. They fundraised with their lemon shakeup stand and donated the proceeds to three high school groups who volunteered to help them.

Craig said the future of the chapter is in doubt, even though they are hanging on for now.

Calls and texts to the presidents of Bureau County and Peoria were not returned. Two of the chapters with which I liase, Carbondale and Waterloo, remain active in their communities and their numbers are holding steady.

Illinois District Music & Performance Report Fall 2026

- Harmony College Midwest (HCM) 2026 took place on Saturday, March 21st 2026 at the DoubleTree by Hilton in Bloomington, IL
 - Overall a successful event. Positive feedback received from individual attendees as well as quartets.
- Budget concerns
 - 2026 event was considerably over budget.
 - Cost of travel and goods has increased.
 - Venue/food costs have increased as well.
 - We are aware of the deficit and are making considerations for the 2027 budget accordingly.
 - Adjustment of cost of attendance for individuals and quartets, within reason.
 - Limit number of clinicians traveling extended distance.
 - Improved advertising to try and attract more out of district participants.
- Looking forward to HCM 2027 and beyond
 - Official date will be Saturday, March 20th 2027
 - Locking in contracts for head clinician and featured quartet. Currently Drew Wheaton and Sunday Night Social, respectively.
 - We have received feedback about interest in more personalized vocal coaching for individual attendees
 - Looking into establishing a "Vocal Pedagogy" track at HCM 2027 to offer individuals more one-on-one opportunities to work with coaches/clinicians aside from normal classroom settings. May be pushed into 2028 depending on budget availability.
 - Track size may be limited due to time slot availability.
 - Looking into establishing a directors track for current or prospective chorus directors to work with established, veteran directing clinicians. May be pushed into 2028 depending on budget availability.

Fall 2026 IL District Marketing and EVP Report

EVP chapter visits

Along with the New Tradition chorus, I visited the Chorus of DuPage, the West Towns Chorus, and had fun at the Visited the Brat Bash.

International Convention

I attended the international convention in St. Louis, sang in the mic-tester chorus, and on behalf of the district wished Sound of Illinois well at a joint rehearsal they had on site with the Alexandria Harmonizers just prior to their fabulous performance in the contest. I was able to track down some members of our past district champion quartets who sang during the international festivities: Triple Threat, Onset, and Linc 182; they were all great and made our district proud.

District Presidents' Council

I attended the meetings at the mid-winter convention in Pasadena (in person) and at the international convention (via Zoom). District EVPs join the district presidents to get up to speed on what is transpiring in other districts, share ideas, and also represent the districts' wishes to BHS leaders.

CEO Robert Rund has also started a monthly informal lunch-and-chat with district presidents and EVPs, and I've attended those.

The society has a new process and structure for handling potential violations of the code of ethics, and I participated in its review prior to publication.

All-District Marketing Group

BHS started an online chat group to help districts share marketing success stories and opportunities, and I have participated in those discussions regularly.

Website

Here are the key items done since the HOD meeting in spring 2026:

- The site experienced some technical issues and I worked with the developers to identify the problems and address them. A couple problems have yet to be fixed and I continue to be the squeaky wheel.



- Promoted the international convention, encouraged members to go, and recognized our district representatives, Sound of Illinois, Linc 182, and sing-in participant Onset.
- Updated the site with information to promote the fall convention. I will add the registration link as soon as it is available after our board meeting.
- Published spring and summer issues of “From the Vault.” A big thank-you to Rich Hansen.
- Mike Isely recently sent the current data, downloaded from the BHS members-only database, and in August I will push it onto our website:
 - Chapter officers, chapter/chorus contact information, and chorus rehearsal sites.
 - District officer and operations team information.
 - Active quartets.

Social Media

Continued to post and add followers on Instagram and Facebook, highlighting all the district and chapter goings-on that I became aware of.

Planning for the Future: 2027 Big Leap and chapter revitalization

- I am working with leaders from BHS, LO’L district, and Pioneer district to potentially hold a Big Leap leadership training event in the midwest. Big Leap events have been held in Dallas, DC, and Springfield, MA. Many chapters that attended have begun to transform themselves and become successful community arts organizations. Should the Board authorize a Big Leap, it will likely be in the Chicago area in spring 2027. Bill Stauffer and Joe Cerutti from BHS are looking into the availability of the faculty members. Roger Menard, president of the Northeastern district, which hosted a Big Leap last April, met with us via Zoom and gave us great information about what he did, how he recommends we organize and market the event, and why he feels there isn’t much risk involved.
 - Chapters would pay a flat \$400 registration fee (or whatever rate we set) + their travel expenses. For that, they could have up to 5 chapter members attend – and it is essential that a given chapter have multiple attendees so they don’t return home and run into resistance from other members.
 - The event runs Friday, Saturday and part of Sunday – and BHS is not able or willing to split it up into more than one event; in fact, they believe that much of the value of the program stems from a weekend-long immersion. And, the logistics are much simpler when the event takes place on one weekend.
 - BHS is polling the faculty members regarding availability, but we would be sure not to conflict with Harmony College Midwest or district spring conventions.
 - We would have attendees pay for their hotels and meals, so the costs we would need to offset via registration fees would be renting a meeting room and travel expenses for the faculty (5 or 6 teachers coming from out of town). We would also need to reserve a block of rooms at the hotel, and would thus need to forecast attendance well enough to avoid any penalty charges.



- o We could consider scholarship programs that a chapter could qualify for, perhaps partnering with IDEA to help fund this and increase the % of chapters who send strong delegations to the event.

This is my first convention as your District Representative of Contest and Judging, and I'll admit—it's been quite a learning experience! There are a lot of moving pieces that go into making a contest successful.

Thankfully, I've had a lot of great people helping along the way. With their help, I feel really good about where we are heading into this weekend, and I'm confident we're set up for a successful convention and competition.

Looking ahead, our next five convention and contest weekends have been penciled in so the Society can better forecast judging availability. They're also limiting the number of districts sharing a contest weekend to no more than five, because it's simply becoming impossible to fully staff contests when too many districts are competing at once.

We'll also be one of the first districts to beta test electronic, or paperless, scoring. There's still some work to figure out, and everything will also be manually submitted during the testing to ensure accuracy.

And finally, the 2028 International Convention and Competition is coming to Chicago. We don't have many details yet, but it's going to take a village of volunteers to pull off an event of that size. When we know more, you'll know more!

I'm grateful for everyone who has helped me navigate my first year in this role, and I'm looking forward to a great weekend of competition.

During the last 12 months, IDEA has awarded grants totaling \$5000 for the four Youth In Harmony programs and \$2170 for a chapter sponsored quartet contest, quartet competing at international and Harmony College Midwest scholarships. Donations to the fund during the last 12 months were \$1520 from Sound of Illinois chorus and district members including IDEA Direct contributions from members.

On September the 8th, sent an e-mail reminder to all listed chapter leaders to have their 2027 leadership team in place by October 15, plus a reminder of who should be the delegates for the House of Delegates meeting on September 25.

Currently working on getting a proposal for a possible 2028 Harmony College Midwest nearer to the Chicagoland area.
