II. Society Board Member Report – Rob Hopkins

Mr. Hopkins extended thanks to Tim Pashon for hosting, Wayne Wright for his hospitality and Will Thorndike for his reception.

He brings greetings from President Drayton Justus. Let's remember our core values, namely to enrich lives through singing. Make sure everyone reads President Justus' report, (which was included in the pre-meeting packet). The society has been working on purchasing a building in Nashville, TN, the due diligence is proceeding.

Society membership is 30,652 as of March, 2006. 11 Illinois District chapters have gained in membership over the last year. Let's remember that the district grows if each chapter grows. Retention is important, especially in the first 2 years of an individual's membership. Currently, the retention rate is 50% within the first 2 years and 87% after that. There is an incentive program right now, the 100% club. If a member signs up 5 new members, he will pay no society or district dues. We may want to have the chapters join in this program. Greg W. raised the question if this is a one time shot or a continuing program and Rob did not know for sure.

Everyone should go to Indy, there is a lot of good stuff. The Grandfather/Father/Son Chorus, the Chorus contest on Friday in 2 sessions. Attendance is projected at 7,600 right now, which is a low number.

Ask questions if you need answers on anything. The e-mail addresses of all the society board member are on the back of the Harmonizer.

Sing, Service, Fellowship, and Fun is the 2006 theme. Let's have FUN!

The question was asked as to the overall feeling of the name and logo change. Some don't like the changes but others feel that it helps to merge a historical society with the present day.

III. District President's Report – Will Thorndike

We should address the current health of the district. The fall convention is very healthy but not the spring convention. The IL District has 3 choruses going the Indy, and Bloomington is knocking on the door. Make an effort to attend this International Convention since it is so close. Our Spring Convention numbers are low but still healthy. The QCA is helping to try to get quartets to compete. We are also looking into bringing in outside talent. In regards to the district school, COTS 2006 will undergo major changes and IDAH is getting better as we speak. There is an effort to get the training the quartets want.

We all need to take something back to the chapters. We need to help make the weekly experience fun and fulfilling for the members. Members will want to come back and they will bring friends.

Convention registration was raised by \$5, this will be explained later.

This is one of the possibilities to try to increase attendance and there may also be some changes to the chorus contest. A committee is being formed and ideas are being gathered. We want to increase the fun.

Let me start by saying how honored I am to be back on the Illinois District Leadership Team. The chorus director is the person in the chapter that can have the most impact and from my position as VP of Chorus Director Development I hope to give every tool available to the directors to make your chapters the best they can be.

One of the best parts of this job is helping directors in need. The Illinois District received 4 full scholarships to Directors College this year. The recipients were Tim Knipe, Bruce Richardson, Jim Jarosz and Dee Ford. I know that those directors, and their chapters, will benefit greatly from this opportunity.

President Thorndike has asked me to have 3 events in the district this year and I have proposed the following calendar of events:

- 1) This year's COTS will feature a special section for Directors. We will offer a CDWI (chorus directors workshop intensive) as part of your director track. This will be open to 5 directors and on a first come, first served basis.
- 2) <u>Director of the Future</u> is a program that takes men that have little (or no) musical training and answers all their questions about directing. It is designed to give you the basic hand skills to get up in front of your chorus and not feel confident that you can get them through a song. This session will be held in Bloomington sometime during the late summer or early fall. More information will come at a later date.
- 3) On September 27th, 2006 Bill Rashleigh will be in the district. On that evening we will hold a "Directors Round Table Discussion." This will be a forum for directors to come together and ask questions of Bill and draw on his expertise. Maybe questions about warm-ups, how to fix a specific problem, newest materials available, teaching techniques.....the list is endless. The best part is YOU decide what we are going to talk about. The number of members in the Illinois District, as of March 31, 2006, stands at 1,290. This is an increase from 1,265 members in February, but a decrease of 3 members since the first of the year. The number of members in the Society as of March 31 stands at 30,252, an increase of 57 in the last 3 months. Every district showed an increase in membership from March.

The Society's "100% Club" recruiting program officially kicked off in March. This program is a new recruitment tool that is geared to the individual member. For <u>each</u> Man of Note the member gains, he would receive 20% off his 2007 dues. In the last HOD meeting, the Illinois District, by unanimous vote, voted to waive the district dues for members who receive 5 or more Man of Note awards. Each chapter is encouraged to doa similar promotion. To date, there are 21 members in the Illinois District with Man of Note awards. Each member has 1 Man of Note award. The Bloomington Chapter is leading the way with 6 members earning Man of Note Awards.

An email announcement of this program was sent by me to each Chapter Membership VP and President. 10 Recruiting brochures will be mailed and/or given to each chapter Membership VP or President shortly to help the chapters in their recruitment effort.

Through the first quarter of 2006, 12 chapters showed an increase in the number of members (Bloomington and Springfield are tied with 5 new members for the quarter) while 15 chapters decreased in the number of members (most of the 15 chapters lost only 1 member, but there were 5 chapters with losses of 3 or 4 members and 1 chapter (South Cook) with a loss of 5 members for the first quarter). I plan on sending emails to the chapter membership VP's bimonthly throughout 2006 making them aware of the membership numbers and encouraging them to keep recruiting.

I am asking each District Officer to "adopt" a chapter to help in their recruiting efforts.

The SOP has come to a screeching halt after a great 2005 involvement. Virtually no chapters or quartets have made requests for show evaluations thus far in 2006. Plans will be made to increase chapter and quartet awareness and involvement for the fall show season.

Quartet Promotion Program

Our district Quartet Promotion Program remains inactive as final plans are still being formulated by chairman, Ron Rank. Ron has indicated that his committee is looking for chapter hosts and locations for proposed Parts Parties, which will be held throughout the district. Our dwindling number of registered chapter quartets and competing district contest quartets indicates that a program of quartet promotion is in great need in our district. Chapters willing to serve as hosts or in need of more information are urged to contact Ron.

Society Staff Visitations

Bill Rashleigh will return with a district visit on September 26-28. Bill's visit will be focused on collegiate YIH awareness, as well as multi-chapter visitations. Society Director of Music Education, Rick Spencer, will visit Illinois on October 24-26 as guest clinician for our district YIH Festival in Bloomington. Your DVP M&P is looking for chapters to step forward and host both Bill and Rick with inter-chapter and YIH visitation possibilities.
