#### Thank You

The Society Board joins me in thanking you for accepting the responsibility for leadership in your chapter and in your district. Chapter members are counting on you to make a positive difference. Since our progress as a Society depends on progress in every chapter, we need to focus our efforts on helping make every chapter successful. Thank you once again for making that difference!

One way of making a difference is to share successes with other chapter and district leaders. In that way, you can be a resource for others. I urge you to take advantage of the opportunity to speak with the Society Board's representative to your convention.

#### Membership

Five districts have posted membership gains from the end of August 2005 to the end of August 2006: CSD, CAR, JAD, LOL, PIO. Congratulations go to CSD in particular; the district had the highest net gain of 1.8% in that period. In addition, three districts—DIX, CAR and JAD—have posted gains in the 3-month period of 6/1/06 to 8/31/06. Society-wide, we had 29,200 members at the end of August 2006; that is 537 less than the preceding August. As we struggle with an extended membership decline, there is reason for optimism that our continued efforts will "turn the ship around." We must continue to address ways that we can both increase retention and add new members. That is especially true in those districts where the percentage decrease in the last year has greatly exceeded the net loss of 1.8% in the Society, namely in EVG (-3.4%), MAD (-4.5%), SLD (-6.3%), SUN (-3.3%), and RMD (-5.9%).

New members are not gained at the Society level, but at the chapter level. All of us—Society, district, and chapter leaders—need to ask the question: What has our chapter done in the past few months to find new members? Share your successes with other chapters and your district membership team! Consider, too, what your chapter might do better in the area of retention. Perhaps you could do a better job of orientation. Perhaps you can communicate better with members who have not renewed. On the Society website, you can find "suspended members" by district. I'll bet you will see some very familiar names of long-term barbershoppers on the list. Typically, their membership renewal just slipped through the cracks. A phone call or contact might help remind them? Will you call the men that you know personally, please?

Are you using the "Singing is Life" video in your chapter? It is a great marketing tool, but it will do no good if it sits in boxes or on the shelf. And how about the extra incentive added by the "100% Club"--- your recruiting efforts could earn you a free ride on dues next year!

#### **Conventions**

"Everything's new in Albuquerque --- all we need is you!" This year's Midwinter Convention has all the past favorites plus some new twists. In addition to the Senior Quartet Contest and AISQC Show, there will be a "Buffalo Bills Era Contest" which is bound to be a very special event—look for details in coming issues of the Harmonizer. You won't want to miss Albuquerque; it's a great city with many varied attractions, not the least of which will be our BHS Convention January 21-28, 2007.

Begin planning now for the international convention in Denver next July 1-8. Our conventions and contests just keep getting better and better, and next year promises to be fabulous. You can go to the Society website and pick out your seats; don't delay!

#### **Society Headquarters**

We are making excellent progress on the relocation of our headquarters to Nashville, the Music City. We have a purchase agreement on a building in downtown Nashville—right in the heart of the action—and are well along with the process necessary for closing the deal.

We anticipate that the remodeling of the building will begin around the first of the year and are planning to move the office in the fall of 2007. The Nashville Harmony Experience is expected to be completed sometime later.

Everyone involved in the process is excited about this new beginning and further, believes that from this new location we can make a real difference in our service to our members and in the public's and musical community's awareness of, and appreciation for, our special kind of music.

#### **Leadership Development**

Expanding leadership capabilities is one of the Society AIMS for 2007, and is one of the key and critical areas for the districts and for every single chapter.

COTS is a "good start" for some training and knowledge for those chapter officers who attend, but local district training throughout the year is the real key to support all the chapters, and not just those who can attend COTS. COTS materials are updated, and older presentation methods are replaced with an "attendee-driven" discussion and facilitation.

Districts are discovering the benefits from ongoing mini-training events with groups of chapters in many areas of each district throughout the year. The identification and development of additional resources for training facilitation within each district will engage more members in leadership development and potentially increase the flexibility to host training seminars.

Chapter support is strengthened by Chapter Counselor/Chapter Support Representative programs; Chapter Counselors who are proactive in their contact and support to the chapters can be a value to the chapter officers beyond the actual contact or time spent; chapter leaders must, on the other hand, be willing to reach out to these same district resources. The Society and each district must commit to develop additional ways to deliver training modules and share success stories across the wide array of chapter locations, sizes and goals.

#### Awards Committee Report to the House of Delegates, Barbershop Harmony Society, Illinois District, November 18, 2006

Although the leadership of the Illinois District Awards committee has changed, its philosophy and commitment have not.

<u>Mission Statement:</u> It is the goal of the Awards Committee to recognize those individuals, quartets, chapters and choruses that have made a significant contribution and/or achievement in the Illinois District of the Barbershop Harmony Society.

The new Awards Committee has one convention behind them. After the Fall Convention and Contest, the committee reviewed what went well and what didn't.

- 1. The flier explaining the awards and criteria was well received.
- The trophy display near the registration area was also well received. It was agreed that these features would be repeated at all future contests.
- 3. The announcements and distribution of the awards also went well, and we will continue to spread the award distribution and announcements over the entire contest, as much as possible, rather than have a chaotic, drawn out distribution of awards at the end.

The one thing we might analyze and change was the announcement of the 50-year BHS members from Illinois. Many in the audience disappeared during that announcement.

For the Spring Contest and Convention, many of the decisions that follow are based upon the pending approval of the HOD for the new Spring Contest and Convention format.

The committee members and several other selected people have seen the proposed District Chorus Championship pin. All have praised the basic design. The only improvement suggested was the size of the pin. Most would like to see a larger pin. Syl Wetle has agreed to ask Dick Johnson to make several more designs with the size of the same pin increased by 5%, 10%, etc. We are also suggesting that the pin be presented to the top five choruses. We will ask Dick J. if the backing plates can be done in blue and red for first and second, and white for the third, fourth, and fifth. We may publish guidelines on how the pins should be worn.

We reviewed each of the awards to be given in the spring. For each of the Sol Gamis and Charles Hecking awards the criteria will read, "any documented monetary contributions to IDEA, HF, YIH, and/or local charities will be considered for the award". Mike Bagby will draft a letter for the Sol Gamis Award and Mark Betczynski will modify the letter for the Charles Hecking Award. They will be responsible for distributing the solicitation letters to the appropriate chapter officers.

To determine the "Most Improved Chorus" award, we will use spring-to-spring contest scores. If a chorus did not compete in the prior spring, it will not be

eligible for the award. We will present the award at the end of the contest. The task of the calculation will be the responsibility of the C & J Chairman. The winner will be the chorus with the largest point increase in its score.

Chorus Plateau Awards will be determined and awarded only at the Spring Contest assuming the new contest format is approved. None will be awarded in the fall. In the past, the 1A was rarely given and we might recommend it be eliminated.

For the ABE, Syl has listed the Past District Presidents and living ABE winners. With one exception, all Past District Presidents have won the ABE. Syl and Carl will draft the solicitation letter for ABE nominees. It will be sent to District Officers, Chapter Presidents, and past ABEs. All nominees will then be forward to past recipients of the ABE for selection of the winner.

Bob Cearnal will be handling the BETY award. Carl has received the guidelines for the award from Bob and has sent them to all of the committee members for review.

The Buzz Haeger traveling trophy for the High School Championship Quartet will become a display trophy. Mike spoke with Buzz about this and he agreed with the decision.

Rich Hansen knows who has the College Quartet Champion trophy and has agreed to get it back to the committee. It will be a display trophy.

We received information that the District Chorus Champion trophy was damaged recently even though it has a protective case. In fact, it was damaged while being placed into the case. Mike has agreed to assess the damage and the committee will determine how to repair it.

Syl has started the awards flier for the Spring Contest. He will share it with committee members when it is finished.

We agreed that the Awards Committee should be responsible for engraving the display and traveling trophies and pay for the engraving. We will standardize the font and font size. For the traveling trophies, we will remove the brass plate before the award is given, then once we know the recipient, we will engrave the plate and send it to the winner for installation. Since Paul Tolley will be storing the display trophies, he will be given the task of getting the engraving done for all the trophies where necessary.

We have also agreed that having protective cases for the traveling and display trophies is a good idea. It is possible that Paul Tolley, who has agreed to store them, has the skills or the contacts to get the cases made. We will ask him if he can handle this.
