II. Society Report – Ed Watson

There are new building updates on the society website so be sure to look at those. We get the keys to the new building on 8/1/07 and we move in on 8/24/07. The society employees are in the process of moving themselves. If you haven't noticed, the age of the music staff is getting lower, and that's a good thing. The entire staff is really coming along nicely and they are getting to know each other.

The Denver convention is coming up and the registrations are up about 1000 from last year. Make sure to support your district representative. Jay G. added that the best support for competitors comes from the district level.

Aptify is coming online. This is a database engine and is a change in the computer system. There will be lots of changes in the next 2 months with this.

The board is focusing in a different direction. We want to make this a FUN hobby again. We all need to take the message back to everyone that we are barbershoppers, and proud of it! We'd like to focus on getting music out, especially for YIH. The society is here to help chapters move forward. Let's help directors become good leaders. There is the thought of trying to make COTS into a leadership academy. Call chapters that aren't here at the convention and help them get back on track

Ed W. would like to sing a tag with everyone in the society and got a little closer when he sang with those in attendance. Then Bob C. thanked him for coming.

III. District President's Report

It is very important to communicate the focus of the district over the next 2 years.

- 1. Inclusion. Let's make an attempt to make coaching affordable and available for chapters and quartets. On 4/1/07, there was a conference call for chapter presidents and there will be more on 6/24/07 and 12/16/07. We have golf outings planned on 6/6/07 in the North, 7/14/07 in the South, and 8/15/07 in the Central with a town hall meeting afterwards. The upcoming goal it to reduce the actual or implied division between the north and south parts of the district.
- 2. Membership. This is a year long activity; constantly ongoing.
- 3. Let's help regain trust between the district board and the chapter leadership.
- 4. Let's attempt to communicate the drive for participation. Apathy leads to demise on the chapter, district, and society levels. It's all about participation. I'm excited about what we can accomplish.

IV. Consent Calendar Reports

Jim G. and Syl W. opted off the consent agenda. **Motion was made** to approve the consent calendar. It was seconded and passed unanimously.

Motion was made to approve the minutes of the previous meeting. It was seconded and passed unanimously.

A. Jim Graham - IDEA

Motion was made to approve Bob Cearnal as a trustee. It was seconded and passed unanimously. \$300 was received from a raffle from the West Towns Chorus. The fund is doing well. Motion was made to approve \$750 form IDEA to YIH to be used evenly between the 3 festivals. It was seconded and passed unanimously. The 2006 books were audited by Nick Caccamo.

B. Syl Wetle - Awards

There were and still will be changes in the show program for the contest and changes in the awards. We are recommending the creation of a "Most Entertaining" chorus award. People outside the society can judge also to get all points of view. This will be the responsibility of the Awards committee. Pins are in the process of being created for the top 5 chorus finishers.

V. Old Business

A. Treasurer's Report - Dave Cowin

He handed out 2 years of reports; a complete report through 2006 and a report to date as of the print date. Money comes in from dues and conventions. The 2007 report includes the budget report.

Phil R. asked about finding Dave's replacement as treasurer since he is also the EVP. Phil would like to meet with any potential candidates. Some possibilities are Earl Holtz or Nick Caccamo. Work is being done to arrange consistent audits on our records. As a note, no district funds are going to the golf outings.

B. Update on District Historical Material – Squires / Rolfs

We have some prior contest recordings and would like to transfer them to more modern media. There is a want ad on the district website for this. Contact Bob S. if you have any historical data, information, or documents from the district. We are in the process of fixing much of the historical information.

C. YIH Festivals Update – Rich Hansen

We've enjoyed the cooperation of the Sweet Adelines, they add much to our festivals. We have 3 coming up; 10/22/07 in Coles County, 10/25/07 in Bloomington, and 10/27/07 in Fox Lake. Buzz Haeger has made a generous donation to bring in Men In Black for all 3 festivals. They are the 2005 International Collegiate champions and current international competitors. These are more than just high school festivals, come to one!

D. Harmony Foundation – Bill Ward

There are many requirements when seeking grants. The organization must be in good standing. We were dissolved for lack of paying the reinstatement fee. Much work has been done and we are back in good standing. Tim P. is the registered agent. We must also come up with a vision and mission statement. Bill W. has a proposal. We should also fund everything through the district treasurer so the budget shows as such. The grants come from the Illinois Arts Council. The Elgin chapter has worked on this in the past and has received money in the last 3 years.

Motion was made to review the mission and vision statement as proposed by Bill Ward.

The **motion was then amended** to accept the proposed mission and vision statement as proposed with the fact that it will still be on review. A proposal will be due by the HOD meeting in the Fall of 2007. It was seconded and passed unanimously.

The Ambassador's of Song would love to come to chapters to talk about the monthly program outlined in Bill's handouts. A wine and cheese Harmony Foundation has been established and we would like to include IDEA also. Jim Debusman is arriving to hold town meetings. He will be at the South Cook meeting on May 22, the Chicago Metro meeting on May 23, and the Sterling/Rock Falls meeting on May 24. Mike O'Neil will also be visiting on May 3-4 in the central. E. Membership – Greg Grey

Greg would finally like to formally suspend the Galesburg chapter. **Motion was made** to suspend the Galesburg charter. It was seconded and passed unanimously.

B. CSLT – Phil Rolfs

C. 2008 COTS (Nov. 10th) – Phil Rolfs

2007 was our own design and 2008 is not funded by the society because of the move of the headquarters. I would like Syl W. to help coordinate the event this year and possibly join with CSD. The ILT setup is ongoing, possibly in Peoria and a facility is being sought after.

D. Host Chapter to Convention by Committee – Assessment of first Convention under the Convention by Committee - Thorndike / Rolfs

We should commend Will T. and Al Q. for getting this committee underway. Thanks to the Sterling/Rock Falls chapter for stepping up and helping. This is a much larger job than anticipated. There was no Harmony Marketplace this time. We are looking at a chapter to possibly take on the Harmony Marketplace. There were 8 individuals that worked very hard on risers. Escorts were hard to come by, but the other jobs were doled out. We would accept chapter help.



MINUTES OF IDEA TRUSTEES SEPTEMBER 30, 2006

I. President Jim Graham called the meeting to order at 11 p.m. following the fall chorus competition. Present at the meeting were Graham, Secretary Bob Cearnal, Treasurer Earl Holtz, and Trustees Wally Ryan and Bill Stock. Nick Caccamo attended as a guest.

II. Holtz moved, Stock seconded acceptance of the Spring 2006 minutes. Passed.

III. Caccamo presented his findings regarding his financial review of the IDEA Fund for the fiscal years ending December 31, 2005. In his words, Caccamo stated: "I believe that these financials depict an accurate presentation of the Fund's financial condition for the periods covered." Treasurer Holtz acknowledged that there is an additional \$26.11 to be added to the total available for disbursements, as recognized by Caccamo. Therefore, the amount available is \$7,582.67.

Holtz reported that all concerns have been cleared. Our investments appear to be reasonable, and he encouraged us to remain aggressive, noting that the fund had increased by an average of 6%, due to contributions and investment performances. The balance as of market close on 9/27/06 is approximately \$43,754, up from \$39,817.

Caccamo recommended that Holtz investigate investing some of our funds in a money market, which Holtz agreed to do. Caccamo also agreed to continue to review our financial records in 2007.

Cearnal moved, Stock seconded to receive the report. Passed.

IV. Old Business

A. Contributions for the year included \$1000 from Buzz Haeger, \$100 from Dave Cowin (both of which were announced by Cearnal at the morning's QCA breakfast), \$100

from Jim Graham, \$100 from Bill Stock, \$50 from Don Summers, \$235 from Lake County, and \$100 from Coles County--all of which accounting for \$1685 total for the year. Ryan agreed to send "thank you" cards to recent contributors. West Towns anticipated an excess of \$300 from quilt raffle ticket sales which they sponsored as hosts of the convention.

- B. Stock has sent his article to "Attacks and Releases" regarding member contributions. Graham commended Stock and Cearnal for their announcements for emcees at the contest site.
- C. In the past we have authorized \$500 for Harmony Explosion and up to \$500 for the district's Quartet Promotion Committee. To date, however, we have received no requests for either fund.
 - V. New Business
- A. Election--Holtz moved, Stock seconded that Cearnal stay as IDEA secretary through 2011. Motion passed with one vote against (only kidding).
- B. Cearnal moved, Ryan seconded (way to go, Wally!) to retain officers through their current terms. Passed.
 - VI. The next meeting will be held at the Spring Convention in April, 2007.
 - VII. Stock moved, Cearnal seconded adjournment at 11:50. Passed
